

Reinhardt College at a Glance

Reinhardt College is affiliated with The United Methodist Church. It was founded in 1883.

41 Programs of Study

A master of business administration; and a master of music; baccalaureate programs in: art; biology; business administration (*accounting, general business, management, marketing*); communication (*communication arts, writing for the media, visual communication*); digital art and graphic design; education (*early childhood, middle grades, secondary biology, secondary English, secondary mathematics education*); English; history; liberal studies; math; media, culture and society; music; music education; psychology; public relations & advertising; religion; sociology (*criminal justice/ criminology, family studies and social services, cultural diversity*); sport studies (*sports administration, sports information*); world languages and cultures, organizational leadership, public safety leadership and communication leadership (*degree completion at extended sites only*); and associate programs in criminal justice and pre-nursing.

Schedule

Full session courses last 16 weeks, while Session I and Session II courses last 8 weeks.

Sites

The 540-acre Main Campus is in Waleska, Ga., 45 minutes northwest of Atlanta, Ga. The North Fulton Center is in Alpharetta, Ga., in northern Fulton County. Reinhardt will also offer selected programs in Epworth and Cartersville, Ga.

Accreditation and Approval

The Eulene Holmes Murray Department of Music is an accredited member of the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM).

Reinhardt College is approved by the Georgia Professional Standards Commission to recommend certification in early childhood education, middle grades education, secondary English language arts education, secondary biology education, secondary mathematics education and music education.

The University Senate of the United Methodist Church has approved Reinhardt College to be listed as a United Methodist-affiliated institution.

Enrollment & Academic Focus (fall '08)

1048 students; 3% graduate, 38% upperclassmen; 91% full-time; 59% female, 41% male. Student/faculty ratio is 13:1. Average freshman class has 14 students.

Student Life

Activities include: an outdoors program, intramurals, student government, and groups focusing on service, leadership, the

arts, ministry, music, entertainment and academic disciplines, as well as a TV station and a newspaper.

Reinhardt fields 14 intercollegiate sports: men's and women's basketball, soccer, cross country, golf and tennis; men's baseball and lacrosse; and women's volleyball and fast-pitch softball. Cheerleading and dance are club sports.

Seven residence halls, with varied room set-ups, are offered. 51% of Main Campus students live on campus (fall '08).

Targeted Programs

The Honors Program offers in-depth courses for those who excel academically. The academic support office, ASO, conducts a program for students with specific learning disabilities.

Graduates & Alumni

In 2009, Reinhardt awarded 201 degrees. The College has more than 10,000 living alumni.

2009-10 Budget

Total operating budget is \$19 million.

Economic Impact

The College's economic impact in 2003 was \$43.4 million, as determined by a study sponsored by the Georgia Foundation for Independent Colleges.

Support

Reinhardt is supported by alumni, friends, parents, foundations, businesses and organizations, the North Georgia Conference of The United Methodist Church, churches and Sunday school classes.

Endowment

The College's endowment is \$30 million (as of 3/31/09). These funds are used for purposes that are consistent with donor wishes. They support student scholarships, faculty research and the expansion and maintenance of campus facilities.

Student Aid

Reinhardt awards merit, leadership, athletic, music, art, United Methodist, academic program and need-based aid, scholarships and grants.

Students who are legal residents of Georgia may be eligible for the Georgia Tuition Equalization Grant and/or the HOPE Scholarship. Cherokee County residents may also qualify for the Cherokee County Grant.

Grants, loans, student-work and scholarships assist students and their families. For fall of 2008, approximately 94% of Reinhardt students received financial aid. Almost 58% received Federal aid, while almost 77% received aid

from Reinhardt. The average award was approximately \$6,828 a year.
