
DR. JERNIGAN BIDS FAREWELL TO REINHARDT


My prayer is that Reinhardt will continue to grow in peace and love and that Christ's joy may be yours in the years ahead.



PRESIDENT FLOYD A. FALANY

On Thursday, March 15, Dr. Floyd A. Falany assumed the Presidency of Reinhardt College. He succeeded Dr. Allen O. Jernigan who had held the post since 1973. The change came almost four months earlier than expected because Jernigan had accepted the post of Director of Development with the International Nursing Services Association. Falany was named president-elect in November 1983.

Dr. Falany brings a strong background in college administration to his new post. He has served Reinhardt since September 1973 when he was appointed academic dean. Two years later he was promoted to Dean of the College. In 1981 he was named Executive Vice President and Dean. Today he is the College's new leader as it enters its second century.































































CONVOCATION SERIES BRINGS MANY SPEAKERS TO CAMPUS


OMEGA AND PHI NU SWEEP PANHELLENIC AWARDS















































GREEKS BATTLE FOR SUPREMACY














GRADUATION '84 Caps, Gowns & Diplomas ...

AMY SMITH WINS COVER DESIGN CONTEST


