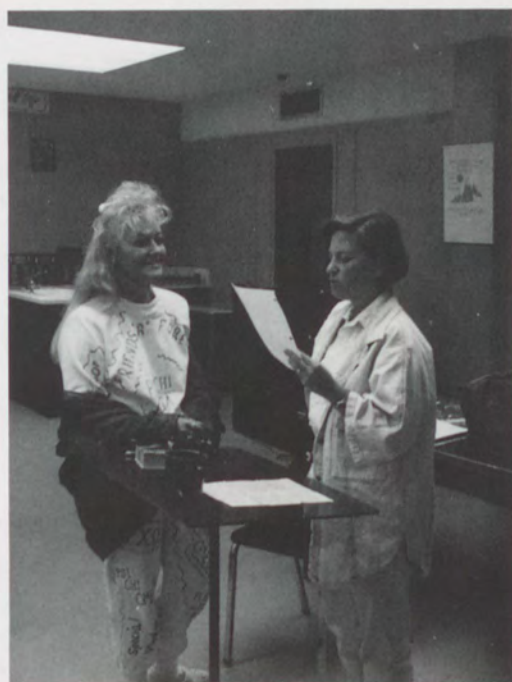

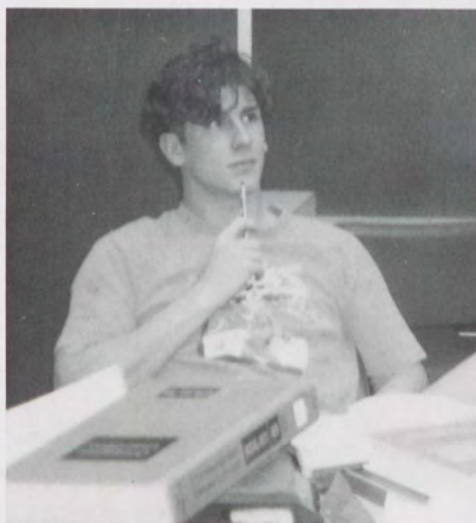

A GLIMPSE AT OUR BEGINNING

The year 1983 dawned as a milestone for Reinhardt College. One hundred years before this institution had its beginning as the dream of two Methodist laymen, John J.A. Sharp and Captain A.M. Reinhardt. The two wished to found a school where the young people of Civil War ravaged North Georgia could receive an education.

In 1883 Georgia was still feeling the

effects of defeat in that conflict. In Cherokee County modern education as we know it did not then exist. There was no school where the sons and daughters of those Reconstruction Era families could attend to acquire even the most basic educational skills.

Sharp and Reinhardt's vision to further the education of the residents of north Georgia was a deep and abiding one.

Reinhardt College has come a long way since its founding 100 years ago in a tiny cabinet shop. The dream of those two Methodist laymen has been and continues to be a reality.

REINHARDT HISTORICAL DATES:

1883 - Reinhardt was established.

1884 - Reinhardt Academy opened.

1885 - First administration-classroom erected.

1888 - First commencement of Reinhardt.

1890 - Reinhardt was incorporated as Reinhardt Normal College.

1892 - Wood Chapel built at Reinhardt. (Could seat 1,200 people)

1896 - Heidt Hall built.

1903 - First business course offered.



- 1904 - First telephone began service in Waleska at Reinhardt College.
- 1905 - Uniforms suggested for boys. Girls already wore uniforms.
- 1906 - First automobile on campus.
- 1911 - Hawkes Hall and Cherokee Hall constructed. Reinhardt became Reinhardt College. Administration building (built in 1885) and Chapel (built in 1892) were destroyed by fire.
- 1912 - Water system at Reinhardt.
- 1913 - Witham Hall completed.
- 1916 - Electricity at Reinhardt. College owned power plant.
- 1916 - Reinhardt changed from the semester system to the quarter system.
- 1918 - Reinhardt started regularly offering Education courses.
- 1920 - Reinhardt fielded a football team.

- 1921 - First college students graduated from Reinhardt.
- 1925 - Reinhardt grammar school transferred to the Cherokee County school system.
- 1926 - Construction of Dobbs Hall.
- 1929 - Electricity from Georgia Power to Waleska. Stock barn and Dairy barn built.
- 1931 - (Old) gym constructed.
- 1931 - Lewis Hall burned.

- 1934 - Hawkes Hall burned.
- 1935 - Cherokee Hall built.
- 1939 - Heidt Hall torn down and Paul W. Jones Hall constructed in its place.
- 1942 - Road from Canton to Waleska paved. It ended just east of Waleska.
- 1945 - Road through Waleska was surfaced and sidewalks were paved.

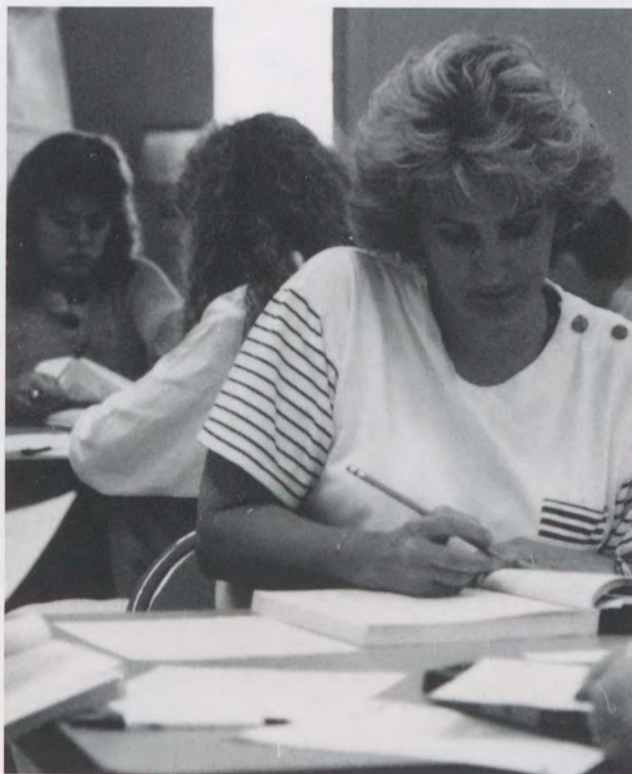

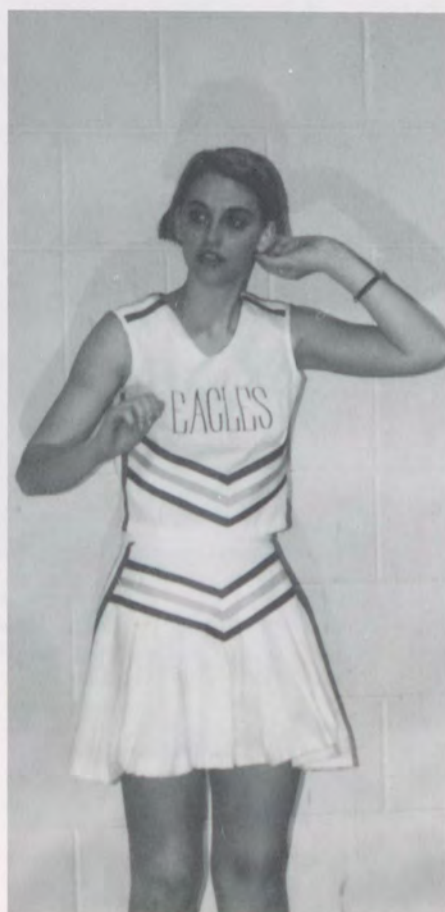

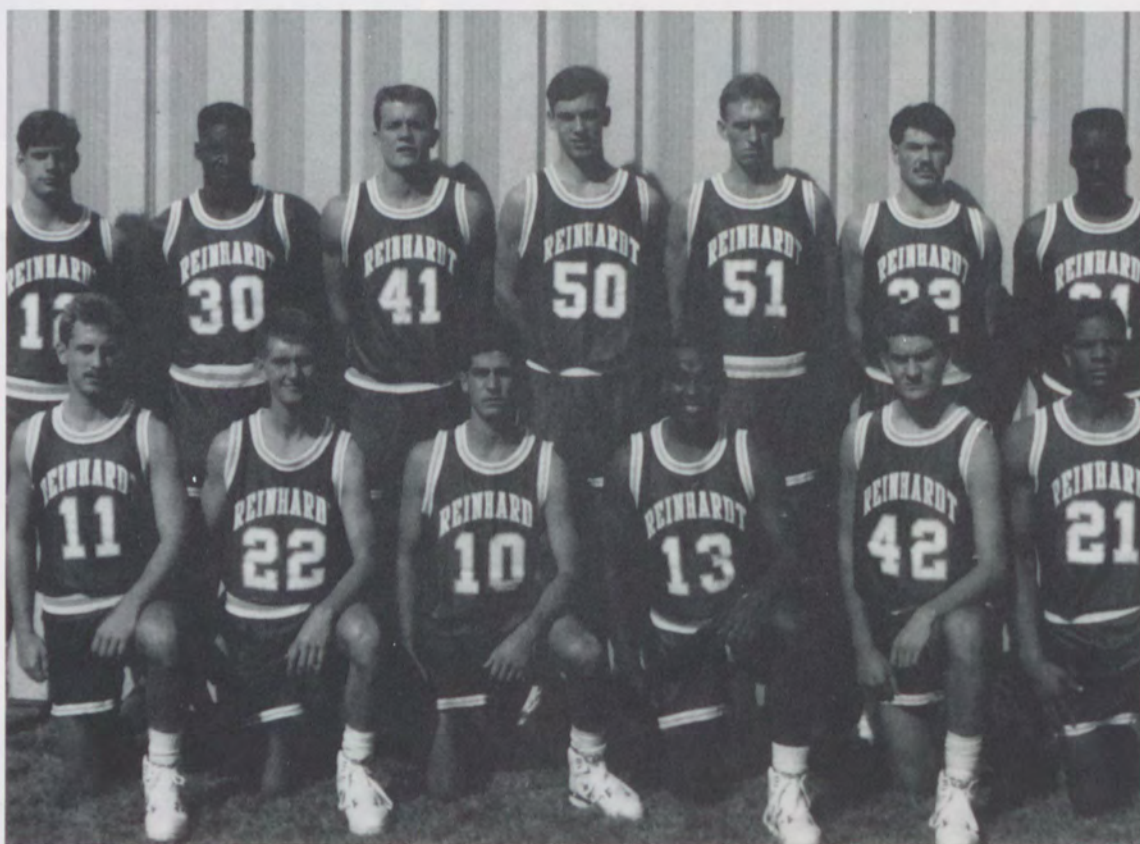
