Prior to submitting your appeal to the Director of the Center for Innovative Teaching and Engaged Learning (CITEL), you must complete the first two steps of the appeals process as outlined below:

<u>Step 3</u> – If there is no resolution after meeting with the School Dean, you may submit, in writing, your request for grade appeal. Compose a written statement explaining your reason for appeal and note the decisions made by the Instructor and School Dean in Steps 1 & 2 above. Make sure to include copies of any documentation that you want to include for consideration of your appeal. <u>Step 4</u> – The Director of CITEL will review your appeal and investigate the claims with both the Instructor and course School Dean. If needed, after this review, you will be contacted by the Director of CITEL and a meeting will be set up to further discuss your appeal. If no further discussion is necessary, you will receive a written judgment regarding your appeal, via your Reinhardt University student email, and the final judgment will be forwarded to the Registrar's Office for recording.
